I am so very proud to announce that this spring, The Brooklyn Hospital Center received the highest grade of all Brooklyn hospitals for our commitment to keeping patients

safe as measured by the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade. In fact, no other hospital in New York City received a B, and only one received an A. The Leapfrog Group, a national nonprofit healthcare ratings organization, grades approximately 2,500 hospitals across the country on how well they keep patients safe from harm.

Developed under the guidance of a Blue Ribbon National Expert Panel, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses multiple measures of publicly available hospital safety data to assign A, B, C, D and F grades to hospitals twice per year. It is calculated by top patient safety experts, peer reviewed, fully transparent and free to the public.

Through hard work and careful focus on quality, we have received this excellent grade. TBHC has invested millions of dollars over the last few years to hire top doctors and specialists who have created new approaches to care and a better quality and safer environment for patients.

The hard work has been a group effort. This grade is a testament to the outstanding effort made by all the clinical, nursing and ancilliary teams throughout the hospital. On page 5, you'll read a more in-depth story of what this all means for you and your family. These efforts are all important pieces of a larger long-term transformation plan for TBHC as we prepare ourselves for the next 175 years of serving our Brooklyn community.

A YOUNG GIRL GIVES HATS TO TBHC CANCER PATIENTS

Skye Workman reminds us of the power of one person's good efforts.

Beanies, baseball caps, berets—the hats that 12-year-old Skye Workman gathers represent a dazzling assortment of how one can cover a head for protection, self-esteem and love.

Skye, a Brooklyn 7th grader at Saint Bernard Catholic Academy, knew a patient who lost hair from cancer treatments. "That really felt hard," she said. As someone who enjoys a fashionable beanie, Skye thought about how wearing a hat would make the difficulty of hair loss a little easier. Skye transformed her musings into action. She started a nonprofit foundation called Skye's the Limit when she was only 9 years old and asked friends and family if they could donate hats for cancer patients.

The hats flooded in. TBHC was a recent beneficiary of a batch of 150 hats. "My mom mentioned The Brooklyn Hospital Center as a good choice for the donations," Skye says. TBHC takes care of cancer patients of all ages and the hospital was delighted to receive such a generous and heartfelt gift. When Skye dropped off the hats, she met leadership and took a tour of the hospital. ONE PATIENT'S EXPERIENCE

Elspeth Macdonald: designer, teacher, writer, dancer, TBHC orthopaedic patient

Elspeth Macdonald has been active all her life. She ran three marathons, the last one at age 50. More recently, she enjoyed cross-country distance running. When she tripped while running on a dirt road a few years back, she hurt her left knee. She was afraid of surgery, but when the pain only got worse, her acupuncturist told her, "Go to Dr. Joseph Fetto at The Brooklyn Hospital Center."

At TBHC, Ms. Macdonald found a caring, professional team committed to her best outcome, led by Dr. Fetto, Chief of Orthopaedics. From her welcome, to the nurses at her bedside, to transport, to the procedure itself, "Everyone was lovely," When it was time for rehab, her TBHC care team suggested a few physical therapists they felt would be best for her.

Just three weeks after the surgery she had feared for many years, Ms. Macdonald was back in a class taught by Dances for a Variable Population. Now, she can walk over five miles a day without constraints, and was even invited by her dance teacher to the most difficult class offered. Ms. Macdonald provides a straightforward appraisal of her experience: "I want a t-shirt that says, 'Ask me about my knee doc at The Brooklyn Hospital Center.""

TBHC's orthopaedic surgeons combine surgical expertise in areas such as bone stimulation, tissue repair, total joint reconstruction and sports medicine.

Conditions treated include:

- Arthritis
- Bursitis
- Tendonitis
- Deformities
- OCD lesions
- Strains, sprains and fractures
- Shoulder conditions, such as labral tears and rotator cuff injuries

- Knee condition, such as meniscus tears, torn ACL and other ligament
- Foot and ankle conditions, such as flat feet, high arches, Achilles tendonitis and tears, peroneal tendon injury (acute and chronic), and stress fractures
- Sports injuries

Treatment options include:

- Advanced reconstructive surgery of the foot, ankle, knee and shoulder
- Total joint replacement of the hip and knee

- Minimally invasive arthroscopic surgery of the shoulder, elbow, wrist, knee and ankle
- · Cartilage and tendon repair
- Inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation
- Pain management
- Pediatric and geriatric care
- Trauma surgery
